



Santa Teresa County Park and Calero Creek/Los Alamitos Creek Trails

Santa Clara County

From: Pueblo Day Use Area

To: McKean Road in San José



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Length: 6.3 miles one-way (plus 1.1 mile return trip from Coyote Peak); car shuttle possible.

Elevation Gain/Loss: 805 feet/1,020 feet (includes round-trip to Coyote Peak)

Accessibility: Hikers, equestrians, and mountain bikers; wheelchair users can use Calero Creek and Los Alamitos Trails.

The Ridge Trail route branches east and west through Santa Teresa County Park. Take a round-trip trail east through high, oak-studded grasslands to Coyote Peak. Then head west on well-graded, exposed paths, past spring wildflower displays, serpentine outcrops, and Coast Range views. Listen to the sound of running water on the tree-lined Calero Creek Trail, and finish on the wide, paved, partially shaded Los Alamitos Creek Trail. The trail through Santa Teresa County Park is exposed and can be hot in summer and early fall.
