We made it through some rough terrain in 2020, thanks to Ridge Trail supporters like you. The pandemic upended life as we know it, but it only increased the importance of parks and open space to our communities. Nearly all trails saw a substantial increase in visitors. Hikers, cyclists, equestrians, and families sought out nearby nature, and hundreds signed up to care for trails and participate in our Ridge Trail Challenge.

PROJECT HIGHLIGHTS



SANTA CLARA COUNTY Berryessa BART

After years of anticipation, the Ridge Trail's **first BART connection** opened in June. You can step off the train at the Berryessa BART station and directly onto the Ridge Trail. The new 0.7-mile trail section connects 9 miles of Ridge Trail from the station, along the Penitencia Creek Trail, through Alum Rock Park and up to the sweeping views and serpentine landscape of Sierra Vista Open Space Preserve.



SAN MATEO COUNTY Oljon Trail

In December, the Ridge Trail gained almost 2 miles, with the dedication of the **Oljon Trail** in Midpen's El Corte de Madera Creek Preserve. This gently winding trail has something for everyone, with fun curves and turns for mountain bikers, mushrooms and ferns for naturalists, shade and gentle grades for families, and dense redwood shaded paths for hikers.



NAPA COUNTY Suscol Headwaters Preserve

In the Spring of 2020, the Ridge Trail dedicated 1 new mile of trail in **Suscol Headwaters** Preserve, adjoining Skyline Wilderness Park. The Suscol Ridge Trail offers stunning 360° panoramic views. This out-and-back trail is open for all user groups, including hardy hikers, equestrians, and mountain bikers.

ADVENTURE Circumnavigation

As longer and longer stretches of the Ridge Trail are knit together, interest in circumnavigation—our term for traversing all dedicated Ridge Trail—is growing. Many take on the challenge (hiking, biking, or riding) section by section, sometimes over months, years, or even a decade. With almost 400 miles of the ultimate 550-mile route now complete, the idea of an epic adventure in our backyard is ever more appealing. That's why we're developing new tools to help aspiring circumnavigators explore the Ridge Trail, track their progress, and connect with others. Looking for the ultimate adventure? FUTURE PLANS Gap Analysis Plan

The Gap Analysis and Action Plan crystallizes years of work, taking a deep dive with our partners to review 152 outstanding gaps in the Ridge Trail route. The Plan builds off a GIS database and takes an innovative approach, using compelling graphics, annotated maps, and summary tables to tell the Ridge Trail story. The result helps facilitate new insights, strategies, and actions to accelerate trail completion. The Plan recently earned an award from the California Trails & Greenways Foundation! 




